McDowell County Technical Education Center in Welch WV, and Bluefield State College (BSC) agree to offer an articulated program allowing students who have completed specific courses and programs of study in Law Enforcement Services pathway and are completers of Law, Public Safety Corrections and Security cluster to transfer up to 9 credits and waive requirements for the following BSC Courses:

- **CRMJ 151 Introduction to Criminal Justice 3 credits**
- **CRMJ 221 American Correctional System 3 credits**
- **CRMJ 232 Criminal Justice Writing 3 credits**

The following general principles guide this agreement:

- This agreement is solely intended for students who have completed courses associated with the Law, Public Safety, Corrections and Security Cluster/Law Enforcement Services Pathway.
- Students must complete and submit a provisional enrollment form from BSC in order to receive transfer credit. Students must then register for the equivalent transfer course(s) as a fee waiver at BSC.
- Students must maintain at least a 2.50 cumulative grade point average or have a minimum of an 18 ACT composite score in order to enroll at BSC.
- This agreement becomes effective on the date set forth on the first page of this document. Both entities agree to publicize this program. They further agree to monitor the necessary performance and to revise it as necessary. The agreement may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice to the other. Termination of the agreement will not affect any students currently enrolled at McDowell County Technical Education Center at the time of termination, and they shall be able to transfer credits to pursuant to this agreement.
